

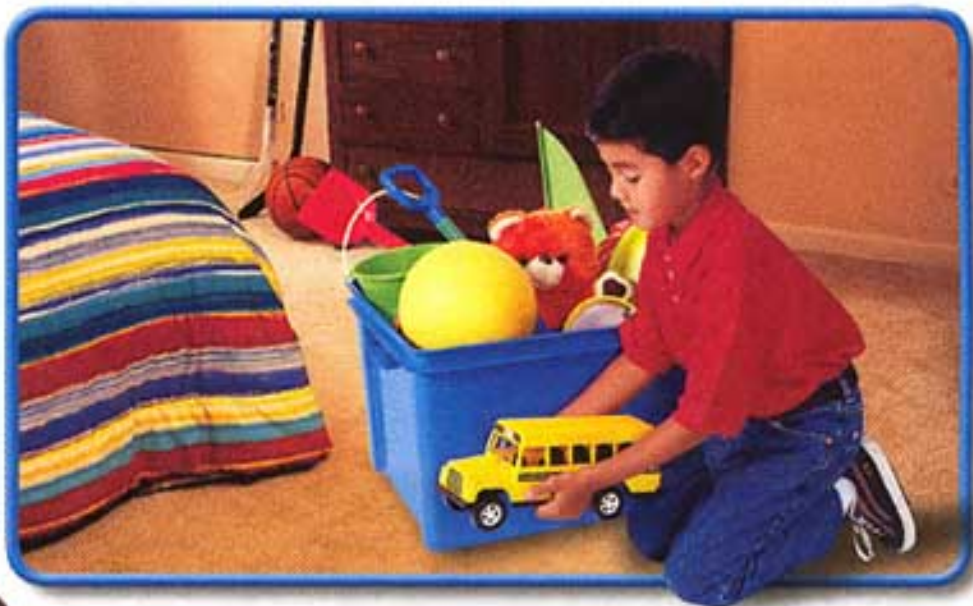


Ben's Jobs

Next, I feed our dog. My whole family takes turns caring for Rusty.

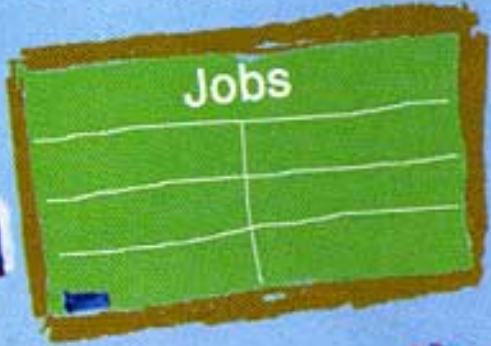


Last, my family and I work together to make dinner. I like to help cook. When the work is done, we all eat. I like that part the best!

A **chart** is a way to show things using words and pictures. This chart shows some special jobs children do in school.
